### Protecting You Against West Nile

Mosquito control activities are conducted year-round by the City of Coppell, but these efforts are increased from April through October, when mosquito season in North Texas is in full swing.

Using traps designed for mosquito collection, the Environmental Health Department regularly collects mosquito samples from various locations throughout Coppell.

Mosquito spraying is scheduled based on positive findings of West Nile virus in these traps. The area around the positive finding is sprayed on back-to-back nights (weather permitting) to help limit the spread of disease.

Spraying isn't the only measure taken to help limit exposure. Residents are urged to be vigilant in protecting themselves when going outside.
